STAY ALL NIGHT - BUDDY HOLLY'S COUNTRY ROOTS

CD with **TWO NEW BUDDY & JACK TRACKS!**

Scott Porter wanted to produce a CD of the type music Buddy Holly was listening to before rock 'n' roll came along. Aside from 18 tracks by the likes of Tommy Allsup, Bob Wills' Texas Playboys, Larry Holley, Travis Holley, Jack Neal, Larry Welborn, Joe Ely, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Butch Hancock, and a nice spoken intro by Billy "Gotta Travel On" Grammer who also sings his song, there are two very special tracks.



Jack Neal was the very first to perform with Buddy Holly on radio. He and Buddy performed The Buddy And Jack Show every Sunday afternoon at KDAV Radio beginning in 1953. When Jack left, Bob Montgomery then teamed up with Buddy. Buddy Holly and Jack Neal recorded two tracks at KDAV in 1953: "I Saw The Moon Cry Last Night" and "I Hear The Lord Calling For Me". Both feature Jack singing and Buddy playing guitar. Jack kept the acetate all these years until I purchased it from him a while back.

The CS comes in a foldout cardboard case and also features a nice booklet with many pictures and stories about each track.

Drummer Carl Bunch also plays on this CD as well as Robert Reynolds of the Mavericks and Grammy winner Al Perkins.

This CD will become a nice collectible considering all of the personnel performing on it and the two new Jack Neal/Buddy Holly tracks.

45 rpm - Rare Live Performance Buddy Holly's CRICKETS - 1978 A great souvenir!

The very first BHMS convention was in 1978 and the original Crickets (Jerry Allison, Joe B. Mauldin, Niki Sullivan) plus Sonny Curtis performed just for us. The concert was taped on a cassette recorder and four of the live songs were mastered for this 45 rpm record. It's a legitimate release, permissions secured, and royalties were paid. The 4 songs on BHMS 100 are "Oh Boy", Maybe Baby", "Well All Right" and "That'll Be The Day".

This was pressed more for its historical value than for its musical quality but it did mark the first time since 1957 that the original Crickets performed on stage together.
